



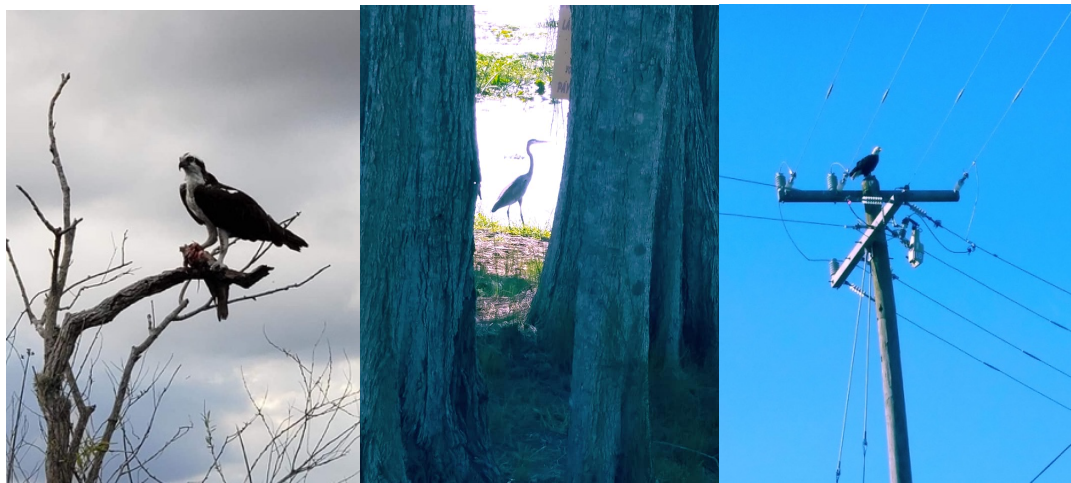
Chapter 7: Air Boat Wildlife Spotting Training
